5. Isaiah 14:12-14 describes what Satan most desires, so what now does Judas desire?
6. What “sweetened the pot” for Judas to betray Jesus? (vs 4-6)
7. Why must Judas betray Jesus when there is no crowd? (21:38)
8. How can we protect ourselves for our own selfishness and Satan’s influence? Pray as God leads.
