- 9. What will God make sure of in verse 14?
- 10. Describe the last days on earth? Vs 15-22
- 11. What will be true of God's elect? Vs 24
- 12. How will the believers recognize Jesus' return? Vs 25-27
- 13. How will the holy angels be involved in the last days? Vs 31
