### Characteristics of Disciple Making:

- Disciple making is an <u>intentional</u> investment into another person that begins with <u>sharing</u> the gospel, grows into <u>encouraging</u> a person to live like Christ, and aims for <u>multiplication</u>.
- II. All followers of Christ make disciples.
- III. Disciple making happens best in the rhythms of life.
- IV. Two mind shifts:
  - 1. Remove busyness
  - 2. Redeem your busyness
- V. How do we disciple another person?
  - 1. Read the Word.
  - 2. <u>Listen</u> to the Word.
  - 3. Obey the Word.
  - 4. Pass it on.
